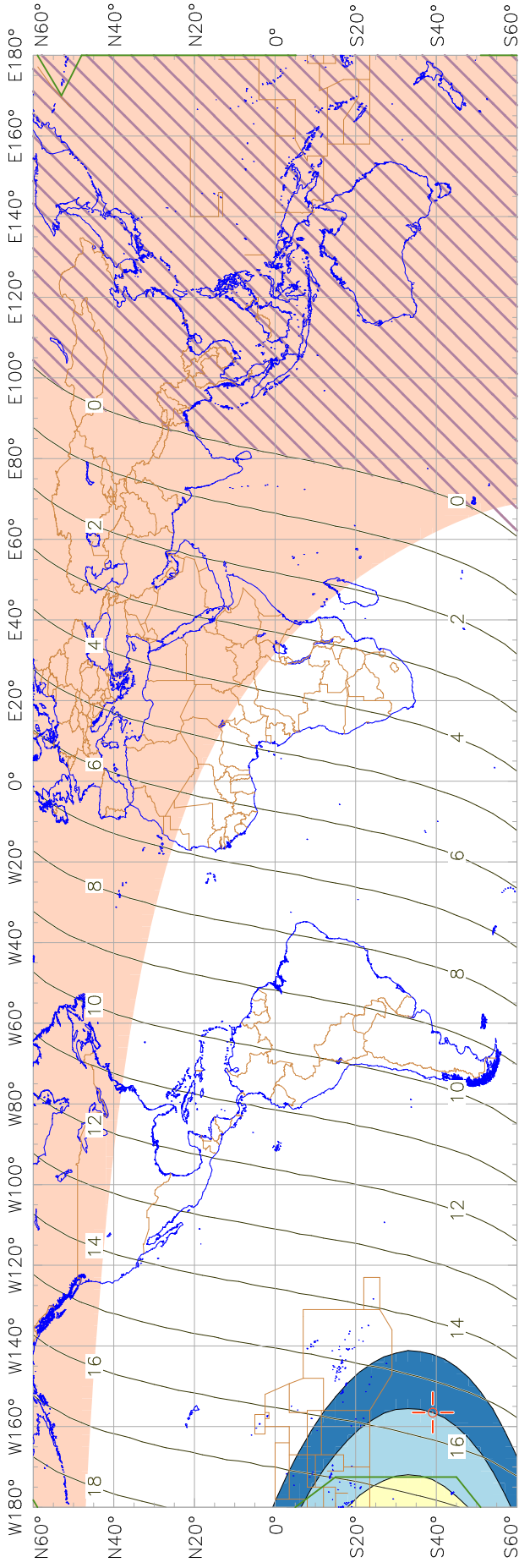


Visibility of the New Crescent Moon for 1990 August 20 (Safar 1411 AH)



New Moon occurred at 1990 August 20 at 12:39 UT

Age of the Moon in hours at the "Best time" ———— 20 ————

Age of the Moon at first visibility with a telescope = 15.53 hours

New Crescent Moon Visibility Key – Colour Coding of Shaded Areas
